Keep an eye out on Dojo for the focuses of next terms meetings.

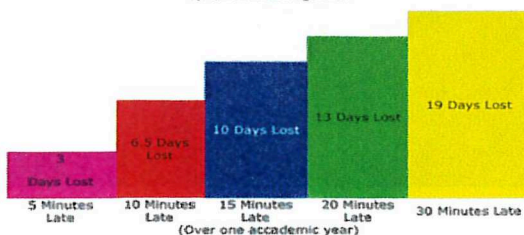


Attendance
