Year 4 have had the privilege of Forest School learning this term. They had the best time building their own tents from sticks and making prints from leaves within the forest.



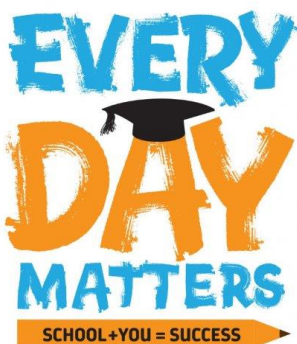
## Science Lap trip
