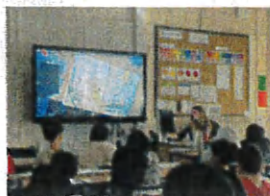


Term 4 newsletter

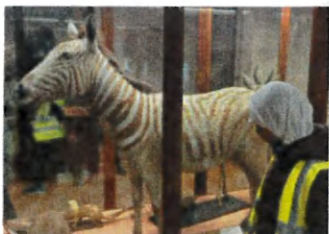
Year 5
