Seat belts in the UK

What age can a child use a seat belt in the UK?


Children must use a child seat until they are 12 years old or 135 centimetres tall, whichever comes first. Children aged 12 or older, or taller than 135 centimetres, may use an adult seat belt or an appropriate child restraint, although it is safer to use a booster seat to 150 centimetres tall.

You're only allowed one person in each seat belt fitted with a seat belt.

It is the law in the UK that you MUST wear a seat belt if one is fitted in the seat you're using.

You can be fined up to £500 if you do not wear a seat belt when you're supposed to.
