


# Curriculum Newsletter

## Readers and Writers

who has always



We will be practising our inference and retrieval skills to find out all the information we can about the characters so we can write an alternate ending for the story. By using expanded noun phrases and a range of compound and complex sentences we will create vivid descriptions!

#### **Mathematicians**

We have now finished our maths work on addition and subtraction, which the children have put brilliant effort into. Our learning in Maths is now going to be multiplication and division. For multiplication, we have been looking at using the column method to multiply three-digit numbers by one-digit numbers. We will also be looking at short division. We will learn how to divide any number by finding multiples within it and explore how we can calculate the answer using a written method.




#### <u>Artists</u>
