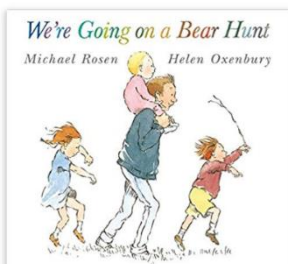
Key date: Trip to Noah's Ark Zoo Farm on Monday 25th November

Readers and Writers

In phonics, we will be putting the sounds that we have learned together to read and write words and simple captions.



We will start to write for a purpose as we play. We will be bringing reading books and tricky words home to practise.



Our book of the term will be 'Bear Hunt' by Michael Rosen and Helen Oxenbury.

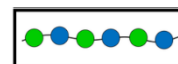
Mathematicians

In maths, we will extend our understanding of number and begin to work with quantities to ten. We



will be talking about addition and subtraction and learning how to find one more or one less than a number to ten.

We will be using mathematical names for 2D shapes and using them to create our own patterns.



Scientists, Geographers and Historians

In Knowledge and Understanding of the World we will talk about different celebrations and how we celebrate them.

We will be learning about colour and light and dark. We will be talking about where light comes from and the children will make a 'cave' to explore the difference between light and dark.



Personal, Social and Emotional

We will introduce 'gem powers' to the children as a way for them to make the right choices in their learning.

Expressive Arts and Design

With colour as a focus for this term, the children will be exploring how to mix and change colours using a variety of paints and other materials.
