


Curriculum Newsletter

Authors



As authors, we will be reading the Jolly Postman. We will be using our Phase 2 and 3 phonics to segment and blend words throughout the book. We will challenge ourselves to read sentences with the support of an adult.

We are going to use our great oracy skills to discuss, retell and act out our story. Ask us all about our book at home - I am sure we will be very excited to discuss it with you!

Mathematicians

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As mathematicians, we will be deepening our knowledge and understanding of numbers within 10. We will start by consolidating our understanding of numbers 1-5, before exploring numbers 6-10. We will be learning to 'subitise with our eyes' and recognise many different representations of number.

Geographers



As geographers, we will be exploring our local area. We will explore the location of our school, our home, key locations in Bristol and learn about the countries and capitals of the UK.

After investigating multiple maps, we will attempt to apply our knowledge and create a simple map and key.

PE PE

As athletes, we will be practising and refining our basic movement skills. This will include our coordination and static balance abilities.

We will be developing our 'athlete' characteristic by discussing motivation, resilience and independence.
