
Welcome to the new school year and Year 1.

Authors



As authors this term, we are reading **We** are going to find a Monster. We will be describing the characters and re telling the story in our own words.

We are going to use our great oracy skills to discuss, retell and act out our story. Ask us all about our book at home — I am sure we will be very excited to discuss it with you!

Mathematicians



As mathematicians, we will be deepening our knowledge and understanding of numbers within 10. We will learn how to 'subitize' by recognising amounts and patterns.

As a class we will also be practising our number formations up to 10 and beyond in every activity we do.

Historians











As historians, we will be exploring changes within living memory by considering a Timeline of three generations of family, Child, parent, grandparent. And the changes that have happened. We will look at a variety of different sources.

We will be using a range of new vocabulary to explain our learning as historians!

Athletes



Our athlete lessons for Term 1 are on Wednesday and Thursday

Children should come to school dressed ready for athlete lessons.

As athletes this term the children will explore and describe different movements. Link movements to a theme and compare movement and skills. These will be developed and enhanced through our Real PE curriculum, Using our creative cog

Phonics



As readers and writers this term, we will be recapping Phase 3 phonic sounds and graphemes, as well as continuing to revisit Phase 2.

Please ask us about our phonics at home.

At home learning



Please listen to your child read at home 5 times per week. This is the most important thing you can do to support learning at this age. Just 5 minutes per day makes a big difference. Don't forget to ask your child to identify the sounds in the words – they will be very keen to show off their phonics skills!

This term we will be keeping their reading records at school and checking daily if your child has been reading. We will change home reading books when appropriate.
