Evergreen Citizens		At home learning At home learning Please listen to your child read at home at least 5 times per week. This is the most important thing you can do to support learning at this age. Just 5 minutes per day makes a big difference. Don't forget to ask your child to identify the sounds in the words – they will be very keen to show off their phonics skills! We will be checking in daily and will change books when appropriate. Have fun reading together!
