We hope you had a lovely break and are ready and excited about the learning and adventures we have planned for Term 5.


Don't forget to log onto ClassDojo each week to check for updates and to see all our amazing work.

We will be continuing to apply our learning from Year 1 and building on the new skills we have been learning in Year 2 to help us innovate our own story and also write a diary entry about the Great Fire of London.

Mathematicians



As mathematicians this term, we will be continuing to deepen our knowledge and understanding of numbers within 100.

We will continue to practise our skills of multiplication and division, focussing on the 5, 10 and 2 times table. We will be exploring division within these times tables too.

We will also begin to look at adding and subtracting numbers to 100 using column addition and subtraction. On Fridays, we will explore money.

Geographers and Historians



As geographers this term we will be investigating continents in the world and looking at the different climates found in different continents and countries.

We will also learn about the equator and the world's five oceans.

As Historians, we will be investigating the Restoration Era, focussing on The Great Fire of London.

As readers and writers this term, we will be coming to the end of our Phase 5c phonics sounds (alternative spellings), as well as revising Phases 2, 3, 4, 5a and 5b.

<u>At home learning</u>



Please listen to your child read at home at least 5 times per week. This is the most important thing you can do to support learning at this age. Just 5 minutes per day makes a big difference. Don't forget to ask your child to identify the sounds in the words — they will be very keen to show off their phonics skills!

We also now all have Times Table Rock Stars accounts to practice multiplying and dividing. Usernames and passwords will be sent home along with more information about how to download the app for free on mobile phones and tablets.
