Authors

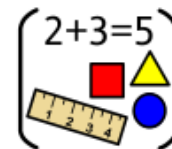


As authors, we will be reading *A Winter's Child* by Angela McAllister. We will be using our Phase 2, 3, 4 and 5 phonics to independently segment and blend words to independently read sentences in the book. We will be using a range of exciting adjectives and conjunctions.

During our immersive section of the term, we will be writing about the Tudors in line with our Historian Learning.

We are going to use our great oracy skills to discuss, retell and act out our story. Ask us all about our book at home – I am sure we will be very excited to discuss it with you!

Mathematicians



As mathematicians, we will be deepening our knowledge and understanding of numbers within 1000. We will be learning about addition, subtraction, multiplication and division. We are always keen to use our strategies... I wonder if we can teach you at home!

As a class we will be deepening our understanding of place value and numbers up to 1000!

We will have weekly maths homework weekly based on our times table knowledge.

Historians



As Historians we will be learning all about the Tudors. We will be perfecting our skills as Historians: learning to assess sources, debate positive and negative impact, looking at significant people, generating questions and undertaking historical inquiry. We will also be looking at how the Tudors helped to shape our modern day lives. We will be using a range of new vocabulary to explain our learning as historians!

Designers

This term in designers we will be learning about textiles. We will be learning how to thread a needle, tie basic knots and sew patterns into cloth.

To further imbed this knowledge, we will focus on textiles during our readin lessons in the second half of term
