

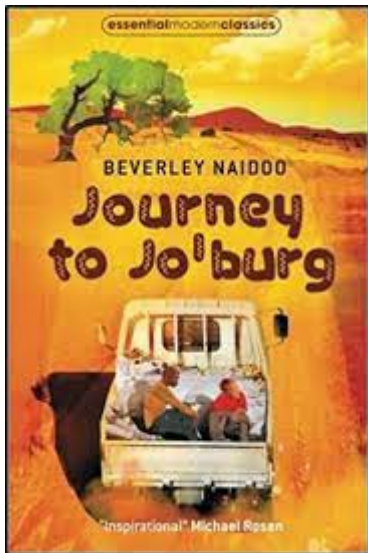
Curriculum Newsletter
